











NAEDI Research Call 3

The National Awareness and Early Diagnosis Initiative (NAEDI) is an initiative to promote earlier diagnosis of cancer and thereby improve survival rates and reduce cancer mortality.





We are inviting proposals in the following areas:

- Investigating reasons for late presentation (to primary care or A&E) and low uptake of screening.
- Developing effective interventions to prompt change, at both individual and systemic levels, to reduce late presentation and low uptake of screening.
- Investigating reasons for delays occurring within primary care and onward referral.

To answer these questions, we have identified two specific areas where we believe more can be done to increase our understanding of cancer awareness, diagnosis and ultimately survival. These include:

- The significance of symptoms across difference cancer types
- Making use of electronic health-related data

Please note that whilst there is not a limit to the duration of projects or funding requested, (as a guide we expect most projects be less than £100k per year), both duration and costs must be robustly justified. We also strongly encourage applicants to submit a research abstract to the office at least one month before the deadline in order to receive feedback regarding the remit of the proposal.

We are inviting full project grant applications by 13 September 2013.

A workshop for potential applicants with guidance and networking opportunities will be held in London on 28 June 2013.
